Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The final online event of the project was jointly organised and carried out by all partner organisations under the leadership of the coordinator. The aim was to organise a bilingual event in German and French for the target groups from both partner countries, at which the project results would be disseminated to the widest possible audience.

After a brief welcome by the consortium two lectures were on the programme of the event. Prof. Dr Johannes Tuchel (director of the German Resistance Memorial) and Séverin Koprivnik (cultural mediator at the Mémorial National de la prison de Montluc) were invited as keyspeakers. In their lectures they introduced the respective national historical contexts of the resistance against National Socialism (Tuchel for Germany/Koprvnik for France). The content of their speeches was made available as a summarised translation in the other language.

This laid the foundation for the presentation of the project results. The project results were then presented by the coordinator (and simultaneous translation by associated project members). This included the educational materials, especially the biographies, with the didactic handout and the online exhibition (https://resist-1933-1945.eu).

Following the presentation of the project results, the project team offered two different workshops. In one workshop, an interactive exchange took place on what can be learnt for the present day by examining resistance biographies. In particular, the aim was to emphasise the differences in the contexts of action of a dictatorship compared to democracy. A second workshop invited the participants to work with two biographies as an example. The examples of Jean Moulin and Gertrud 'Mucki' Koch were used to illustrate the diversity in the learning materials and show how biographies can be used for intercultural learning activities.

The subsequent discussion in the group emphasised the lively interest in the project results. In particular, the challenge of using a biographical approach to draw conclusions about a broader historical context and orientate action for the present was discussed.

In a short closing round in the plenary session after the workshops, the participants gave consistently positive feedback on the event, but especially on the project in general. The participation of many people from different areas of education (formal, non-formal) suggests that the project results will be widely disseminated.
