Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

This work package, organized and carried out by the Gedenkstätte Deutscher Widerstand (Senat of Berlin), was split into six different activities to reach as broad of a target group as possible.

The first activity took place in Leipzig. Like the Goerdeler Foundation (see D11) the Senat has taken advantage of the fact that an international school exchange took place there in November 2022. The decision to carry out an activity here at an early stage of the project was made against the background that the network of teachers created in this way can benefit the project throughout its entire duration.

The activities of the Berlin Senate took place alongside those of the Goerdeler Foundation (also in the hostel Leipzig), but they focussed on a different target groups and were therefore designed differently. The offer was primarily aimed at the teachers who accompanied the exchange. The project and the materials were also presented here, but the focus here was on the presentation of the didactic considerations and how to use the material in different educational settings. After the presentation, the participants were given the opportunity to exchange ideas and discuss the material. This centred on the question of where challenges and opportunities exist for integrating the presented materials into one's own educational practice.

The teachers were very interested in the project presentation by the RESIST project team. Although not all materials were finalized yet, the teachers were very intrigued by the project's approached and eager to try it out and spread the word about among their colleagues.

The other five activities of this work package took place at the Gedenkstätte Deutscher Widerstand in Berlin and addressed a diverse range of groups. Each activity followed a similar pattern: At the beginning, the project context was presented, followed by a presentation of the project results. In an interactive setting, the didactic approach and the materials were explored by the participants. Project staff were present to moderate the interaction with the project results and to answer any upcoming

questions from the participants. At the end, participants had the opportunity to address any questions and feedback in the plenum and join in on a discussion about remembrance in Germany and France.

The groups covered a diverse field of the target groups. Activities B and C were primarily attended by interested parties who are in some way involved in different associations that deal with topics such as National Socialism and resistance. Such people also took part in activity D, but also, and above all, people who are themselves active in non-formal education with special focus on binational exchanges. Activities E and F, on the other hand, focussed on formal education. Activity E was designed as a training programme for teachers and activity F took place as part of a Franco-German school exchange, so that pupils and teachers from these two countries were able to take part.

The various activities in this work package made it possible to cover the entire range of the target group and serve different areas of application and educational settings. All participants responded very positively to the RESIST materials.
